infant car seat

Rearward facing: birth-13kgs Newborn-12 months

An infant car seat comes with a carry handle and doubles as a carrier. An absolute must for bringing baby home as hospitals will not let you leave without baby safely strapped in. Some infant car seats also attach easily to compatible strollers to create a versatile travel system.



convertible car seat

Rear-facing: birth-13kgs. Newborn - 12 months.

Forward-facing with harness: 9kgs-25kgs. 9 months - 6 years.

Convertible car seats have higher height/weight limits, so little ones can ride rearfacing up to 3 years or the maximum height and weight for their seat.




booster car seat

A Forward-facing with harness: 9kgs-18kgs. 9 months - 4 years.

B Forward-facing with harness: 9kgs-36kgs. 9 months - 4 years.

Belt booster: 15kgs-25kgs. 4 years - 6 years. Backless booster: 15kgs-36kgs. 6 years - 11 years.

A 5-point harness helps keep your active tot safe and secure for up to 36kg. A belt positioning booster will provide head support and raises your child up for a better fit.
